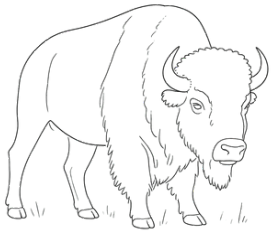


Antelope Island State Park Wildlife Spotting Checklist

☐ American Bison

Where to find them: Bison herds roam the island. You can often spot a large herd near the road on your way to Fielding Garr Ranch. Please keep your distance and do not approach!



☐ Western Meadowlark

Where to find them: You might hear the melodic call of the meadowlark as you explore the island. Look for a bright yellow bird perched on signs and fence posts



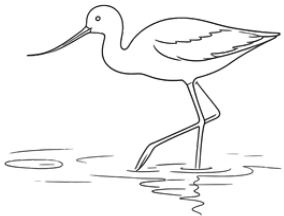
☐ Pronghorn

Where to find them: Pronghorn (also colloquially known as the American Antelope) can be spotted throughout the island, typically in pairs or alone.



☐ North American Porcupine

Where to find them: Some lucky guests have spotted the porcupines in the trees at Fielding Garr Ranch.



☐ American Avocet

Where to find them: Look for these unique shorebirds as you drive across the causeway. You can also spot other shorebirds like Black-necked Stilts, Northern Shovelers, and Long-billed Curlews



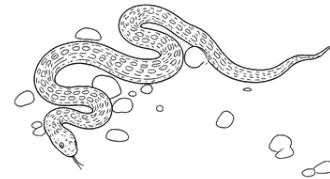
☐ Burrowing Owl

Where to find them: Burrowing Owls sometimes can be seen down the hill from the visitor center. Look close to the ground as they nest in burrows.



☐ Western Spotted Orbweaver

Where to find them: These harmless spiders hatch in the spring and can be seen crafting their beautiful webs on the sagebrush.



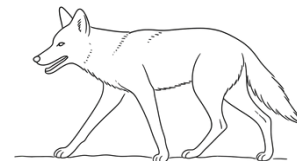
☐ Great Basin Gopher Snake

Where to find them: Snakes might be seen in rocky areas and trails. Don't worry, there are no venomous snakes on the island!



☐ Common Side-blotched Lizard

Where to find them: Lizards are active during the day and can be spotted sunning themselves on rocky areas and trails.



☐ Coyote

Where to find them: Coyotes are active around sunrise and sunset. You might see one around the island, or walking near the causeway.
